## Hospital foundation supports patients, gardens, scholarships, and much more

Rotarians have been involved in supporting the Cass Regional Medical Center Foundation since its inception, current board president Denise Ashby-Cohen said at last week's meeting. It was a former (2001-02) club president, the late Linda Sherman, who spearheaded the effort to incorporate the foundation as a 501(c)(3) nonprofit in 1988. A member of the hospital's Board of Trustees, Linda also was instrumental in establishing the hospital's network of remote clinics to better serve residents in neighboring towns.

Denise, a registered nurse whose late husband Marvin was a surgeon here, was joined by the foundation's new executive director, Jenny Snapp, for an overview of the foundation's wide-ranging scope of work on behalf of the hospital, patients and employees. They were guests of Cassie Wieberg.

Through the years, our club has been involved in several hands-on projects at the hospital, including construction of a pergola, sidewalks, a foot bridge



and concrete pads for teak benches in the Healing Garden. Several club members have also served on the foundation's board. Carol Looney was honored as a director emerita for her long service. Larry Pfautsch is a current board member and past president.

Among the programs and projects funded by the foundation are 12 scholarships, most of them endowed by benefactors to advance health care education opportunities for area students and hospital employees. The foundation is the principal entity supporting the gardens and grounds as well as the Franceline Parris Community Trail. It operates two assistance funds, one for patients and one for employees. It also assists with the purchase of specialized hospital equipment. This year it organized a SCRUBS program to interest teens in health care.

The foundations' work is funded by a mix of private donations and special events such as the annual plant sale, the Celebration Basket raffle coming up Oct. 20-24, and the Boots & Barbecue and Legacy Dinner fundraisers.

Denise said the foundation hopes to organize behind-the-scenes tours of the hospital to make residents more familiar with the wide array of services and facilities Cass Med offers. At the end of their presentation, Denise and Jenny conducted a raffle for a tote bag, won by Abby Lowrimore.
