- We will also have a booth at this year's Fourth of July celebration at the City Park where we will sell raffle tickets and test an ice cream machine that is one of the options being considered for our Burnt District Festival booth.
- We will grill hot dogs for the April 19 Senior Service Day lunch hosted by Rotary at the Elks Lodge. We are looking for a large grill as well as donations of pop, water, etc. Several members will be needed to help cook and serve. Contact Jesica or Jason Winter if you can help.
