Committees plan for new year

In the absence of a program last week, the club took the opportunity to hear a yearend financial update from Treasurer Jesica Junge and then to gather committees for to discuss their plans for the new club year that began July 1.

Several of the committees submitted recaps of their meeting to President Nancy after meeting:

Membership (*Chair Brittney Sexton*) — Membership will be introducing incentives for motivating members to invite others.

Youth Services (Chair Jill Filer) — We will be providing a \$25 Cass Carer Center school store gift certificate to the CCC Young Professional Junior each month during the 2019-20 school year. A Rotarian will visit CCC each month for a photo opp with the honoree.

We will be changing our Service Above Self awards at HES and McEowen. We will no longer give a plaque; instead we will be doing a certificate and a movie gift card with B&B Theater for popcorn, candy,



etc. We will still have a Rotarian present the award at the all-school assemblies. Larry is putting those dates into Sign Up Genius.

We will again participate in the Classroom Partner program at McEowen. Once again, we will be working with Ms. Klinkenberg's 5th grade class.

We will be asking our RYLA participant - George Frees - to look into starting an Interact Club at HMS.

Flags (Chair Glenn Aversman) — Sign ups are going well...we just need to finish the year

Social (*Chair Lynn Laffoon*) — The Social Committee will take over our Log Cabin Festival participation since our involvement has moved away from an emphasis on fundraising. The committee has decided the club will participate in the parade this year.

In business before the program:

- Gabe Sweitzer won the Secret Greeter dollar.
- President Nancy asked members to review their listing in the newsletter roster and report any changes to Larry Pfautsch.
- Service Projects Chair Gabe announced a work day for Saturday morning, Aug. 17, to complete installation of flag holders at Orient Cemetery. Breakfast will be provided.
- Nancy reminded members of the District Gov. Paul Reinert's visit on Aug. 7 and asked all members to make an effort to attend.

Club had a good fund-raising year

With the addition of three fundraisers over the past 1-2 years, the club is no longer having to rely on the Log Cabin (Burnt District) Festival booth for revenue to fund service projects, as Treasurer Jesica reported last week during a brief review of our year-end financial statements.

Our flag program has traditionally been our largest fundraiser, but the newer events have all been successful. The All-Star Rodeo in its first year netted a little over \$3,000, while the Trap Shoot in its second year generated about \$2,300, and the firstyear Zero K event in cooperation with Belton-Raymore netted about \$1,000.

This is in addition to the excess funds we realize from prepaid meals, although the margin will be less this year due to the change in catering providers. Members saw an increase in meal prices on their quarterly statements starting in January.

Overall, the club had a good financial year, ending with a net profit of about \$7,000. One contributing factor is the fact that our scholarships are now selffunded through the Public School Foundation, no longer requiring an annual cash outlay from the club

treasury. At fiscal year-end, Jesica said the club had about \$15,000 in checking, \$12,00 in a CD with Edward Jones, and \$11,00 in a CD in Sherwood Bank.

Members of the Fundraising Committee met last week to discuss plans for the new club year. In addition to our ongoing Flag program, new fundraisers over the past 1-2 years have put the club in good financial shape.
